MACALONEY, James W. – It is with great sorrow the MacAloney family announces the passing of their husband, father and grandfather, James W. MacAloney at home in Five Islands on Monday, December 28, 2009. Born in Five Islands in 1923, he was the son of the late Grace (MacAloney) Crawford and stepson of the late Frank Crawford. He was employed at Enheat Ltd. (now IMP Aerospace), Amherst for over 30 years. During his earlier years, he and his brother Hal operated a lumbering business with a portable sawmill working in Cumberland and Colchester Counties.
